CHILDREN'S PROGRESS

We have recently tracked all of our children's current levels of development and have completed a full analysis of this. The main outcomes were:

Strengths:

95% of boys are meeting age related expectations in managing feelings and behavior.

11% of boys are emerging above age related expectations in making relationships.

94% of girls are meeting age related expectations in understanding.

17% of girls are emerging above age related expectations in Making Relationships.

We are very proud of our achievements in the prime areas of learning as we are exceeding local and national averages

Areas for improvement:

Our main area for improvement is Numbers. Although we are exceeding the local average for Liverpool we are not quite reaching the national average. This will be our main focus for this term.

Next data due the end of February.

The staff may have shown you some family photo books which some of our parents have made. If you haven't seen them please ask your child's key person when you are next in.


How to make a family book for your child: Search the app store for an app called 'freeprints photo'

WORKER BEES

Throughout the month of February, a group of Worker Bees will be learning about people who help us. If you or a family member are able to come in and share any experiences regarding 'People who help us' please speak to Jane.

Another group of Worker Bees will be focusing on letter recognition and forming and writing letters.

They will also be working on pencil control and how to control hold a pencil to form letters.
